BLOOMFIELD TOWN COUNCIL

There was a regular meeting of the Bloomfield Town Council held at 7:30 p.m. on Monday, June 22, 2015 in Council Chambers, Bloomfield Town Hall, 800 Bloomfield Avenue, Bloomfield, CT.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting began with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

ANNOUNCEMENTS & PRESENTATIONS

Deputy Mayor Gamble requested a moment of silence for all of the victims killed in the church massacre in Charleston, SC.

Presentation of Recognition Certificate to Caruso's Auto Body Service

Deputy Mayor Gamble presented Caruso's Auto Body Service with a recognition certificate for their 50 years of service in the Town of Bloomfield.

Presentation of Recognition Certificate to Connecticut Auto Body Shop

Deputy Mayor Gamble presented Connecticut Auto Body Shop with a recognition certificate for their 45 years of service to the Bloomfield and Greater Hartford community.

PUBLIC HEARING

The Bloomfield Town Council held a public hearing for review and approval of the applications to the Neighborhood Assistance Act Program.

The public hearing opened at 7:35 p.m.

1. Mr. Ronald DeJohn, 61 Arrow Road, Wethersfield, CT is representative from the National Association for the Prevention of Teenage Addiction, Inc. He gave a brief presentation of this organization and the effectiveness of their preventive services for teens with addiction.

The public hearing closed at 7:42 p.m.

CITIZENS STATEMENT & PETITIONS

1. Kevin Gough, 5 Bear Ridge Drive spoke in regarding to the East Coast Greenway – Bike Way. Mr. Gough stated that he has been involved with this project since 2010. He is very concerned about lack of progress thus far with building the bike way. He also reiterated the importance to prioritize this project for the town as well as the connectivity to neighboring towns.

Councilor Hypolite inquired about the status update of the overall process of the East Coast Greenway project. It was noted that this project is a key foundation for the town and economic development. Councilor Hypolite recommended further discussion in the Land Use and Economic Development subcommittee.

Deputy Mayor Gamble stated that this project is imperative to the town as well as building the new bike way as a part of economic growth for Bloomfield.

Mayor Schulman stated that this project will be a priority for the FY 2015/2016 capital project list as well as further discussions with the Land Use & Economic Development and Community Services subcommittees.

Councilor Rivers inquired about funding be used for a section to be built in Bloomfield. It was noted that an alternative route would not be in compliance federally with ADA requirements.

Mr. Philip K. Schenck, Jr., Town Manager gave a status update of the overall project. He stated that paperwork has been submitted of all final design criteria to the State of Connecticut – Department of Transportation and the Federal Highway Administration for review. Approximately

\$1.5 million available for this project, which requires a 20% match totaling \$600,000 appropriated from the town.

REPORT FROM COUNCIL SUBCOMMITTEES

Community Services – Councilor Seldon read a detailed report from the last meeting held on June 9, 2015.

Administration & Education – The next meeting of this subcommittee will be held on Monday, July 6, 2015 at 6:30 p.m.

Public Safety - Councilor Washington read a detailed report of the last meeting held on Monday, June 8, 2015.

Committee on Committees – Councilor Washington deferred this subcommittee report for approval of recommendations under Council business.

Golf – Councilor Rivers gave a brief report of the status of Wintonbury Hills Golf Course. The course is doing great financially and has seen an increase in pass holder sales. Management will continue to book outings as well as promotion of the Tap Inn Restaurant to non-golfers residing in the community. Councilor Rivers also noted a generous donation in the amount of \$5,700 from Duncaster, in support of the middle school golf team. In addition, Wintonbury Hills Golf Course ranked 5th in the country as a municipal course.

Finance – Councilor Hypolite gave a brief report of the last meeting held on June 18, 2015. Councilor Hypolite stated as a reminder that tax bills are due for auto and residential. It was noted that most homeowners will see a slight decrease in residential taxes due to re-evaluation. The committee has discussed the State of Connecticut budget process.

Land Use & Economic Development – Deputy Mayor Gamble gave a brief report of the last meeting held on June 18, 2015. It was noted that an auction for Wintonbury Mall is tentatively scheduled for August 8, 2015. CREC recently purchased land in town to a themed based school. The committee also discussed the status of the Bloomfield Apartments on Jerome Avenue as well as the closure of Gillett Ridge Golf Course. Deputy Mayor Gamble also stated that an Urgent Care Center is interested in opening a practice on Seneca Road. The Valco building will be demolished by the end of the month.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Councilor DeLorenzo reminded residents to support the local Food Bank. He also thanked Mr. Kevin Gough for his commitment to the East Coast Greenway – Bike Way project.

Councilor Merritt appreciated Council comments and their renewed interest in the East Coast Greenway project.

Deputy Mayor Gamble stated that the new Greater Hartford Transit District has been transformed to the state of the art facility that is secure and welcoming.

Councilor Hypolite applauded the graduates who gave speeches at the Bloomfield High School graduation. They were eloquent and poised in their presentations. He also extended his thoughts and prayers to the victims of the church massacre in Charleston, South Carolina.

Councilor Washington also commented on the success of the graduates of Bloomfield High School. It was noted that 91% of students with attend college and 67% of graduates with attend a four year university. He also commended Aduke Williams who sang an original song entitled, “I Love My Life”.

Councilor Rivers commented on the recent Bloomfield High School awards ceremony held on June 2, 2015. He stated that approximately \$625,000 was given in scholarship to fellow graduates. In addition, at the athletic awards banquet several students received scholarships to play sports in college.

Councilor Seldon participated in the Bloomfield High School graduation ceremonies. Approximately 134 students graduated from the high school and 25% of graduates receive high honors or honors recognition. Overall, Councilor Seldon praised the Bloomfield Board of Education for their commitment in education and increased test scores.

Mayor Schulman also congratulated two young ladies who sang at the Bloomfield High School graduation ceremony.
