COMMITTEE ON COMMITTEES SUBCOMMITTEE

Ms. Marguerite Phillips, Town Clerk updated the committee regarding the following vacancies:

Zoning Board of Appeals

There is a current vacancy in Zoning Board of Appeals for an Alternate Seat (Democratic-Elected). A disclosure is needed.

Commission of Aging

There is a current vacancy in Commission of Aging (Republican seat). The term ending on November 2017, no disclosure needed.

Ethics

There are four current vacancies on the Ethics Commission. The term ending on June 30, 2018, disclosure needed.

Board of Education

There is a current vacancy on the Board of Education due to the resignation of Susan True, republican seat. The Bloomfield Republican Town Committee will meet on Tuesday, September 16, 2014 for a recommendation to fill this vacancy. The term ending on November 13, 2017, disclosure needed.

Fair Rent

There is a current vacancy on the Fair Rent Commission. This is a Republican seat. The term ending on April 28, 2015, no disclosure required.

Conservation, Energy and Environment Committee

There is a current vacancy on the Conservation, Energy and Environment Committee. This is a Democratic seat. The term ending is November 2015, disclosure required.

In addition, Councilor Neuwirth inquired about recruiting Independents to fill vacancies on boards and commissions. It was noted that each political party has the ability to recruit within their own party as well as encourage those that do not belong to any political party to join and be active.
