There was a regular meeting of the Bloomfield Town Council held at 7:30 p.m. on Monday, November 9, 2015 in Council Chambers, Bloomfield Town Hall, 800 Bloomfield Avenue, Bloomfield, CT.

ELECTION OF MAYOR

It was moved by Mayor Schulman, seconded by Councilor Hypolite and voted unanimously to nominate the Election of Mayor to Joan Gamble.

Town Manager's Report

- The town has awarded the Request for Proposal (RFP) - Affirmative Action bid to HRC Consulting from New Haven, CT. There proposed contract is under review by the Town Attorney.
- The Public Works department is currently reviewing cost estimates for milling and patchwork needed for Woodland Avenue.
- The RFP for 330 Park Avenue has been drafted and submitted for bid review.
- The RFP has also been submitted for the Blue Hills Avenue Streetscape project. There have been no updates regarding the bond request information from Representative David Baram.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Councilor DeLorenzo congratulated Mayor Gamble and all Councilors on being re-elected to office for the next two years.
