KINDERGARTEN

Registration is Now Open for 2025-2026 School Year

Register by August 4th to ensure busing for the first day of school. Your child must be 5 years old by September 1st, 2025 to enroll**. We will have an Open House in February and April. Start the registration process to receive email notification and Open House information.



** Recent legislative changes to the Kindergarten starting age Public Act 23-208 states that beginning with the 2024-2025 school year, all children attending kindergarten must turn 5 on or before September 1st of that school year. For students previously eligible to begin kindergarten, the legislation provides a provision that a child may be considered to attend kindergarten if:

- (1) A parent submits a written request to the principal, and
- (2) The school district completes an assessment that supports the child is developmentally ready for kindergarten. Please visit <https://www.bloomfieldschools.org> for more information.

Respiratory Illness Alert for all residents

FLU , COVID-19 , & RSV ARE ON THE RISE!

Protect yourself and your loved ones

- Respiratory illnesses, including COVID-19, flu, and RSV, are rising nationally and in CT.
- Wastewater data shows high viral activity for all three viruses, indicating increasing infections.
- Emergency visits for COVID are low but rising, while flu and RSV visits are higher.
- COVID cases in CT have risen since the holidays but remain lower than earlier in the fall.
- Hospitalizations increased from 104 to 160 in the week ending 12/28.
- CDC models predict cases will continue rising in the coming weeks.

FIVE EXAMPLES OF WHAT YOU CAN DO

- 1 Wash your hands often
- 2 Avoid close contact with others who are sick
- 3 Staying home when sick
- 4 Clean frequently touched surfaces
- 5 Wearing a mask when sick
- 6 Cover coughs and sneezes - into the elbow or tissue is best



FREE FENTANYL TEST STRIPS & NARCAN

Opioids are a class of drugs that include synthetic opioids like fentanyl and prescription pain relievers such as oxycodone and hydrocodone.

Fentanyl is a powerful opioid that significantly increases the risk of a drug overdose and can be difficult to detect.



✓ **Safety** Fentanyl test strips can be used to check for its presence in substances. Narcan is a safe, non-addictive medication that reverses opioid overdoses.

✓ **Prevention**

The **West Hartford-Bloomfield Health District** offers **FREE** fentanyl test strips and Narcan to prevent overdoses and help keep people in our community safe.



✓ **Supplies are limited. First come, first serve.**

West Hartford and Bloomfield residents can pick up supplies at our Bloomfield location Monday through Friday and West Hartford location Monday, Tuesday and Friday in room 417 from 7:30 am to 3:00 pm. Just walk in, no questions asked. Proof of residency is required (ID, addressed mail).

- Applications are available online or in the assessor's office for anyone wishing to appeal their 2024 Grand List valuation of real estate or 2023 supplemental motor vehicle.

ELDERLY TAX RELIEF FOR HOMEOWNERS & TOTALLY DISABLED

FILING BEGINS FEBRUARY 1, 2025 DEADLINE: MAY 15, 2025

This is to inform you that it is time to apply for the Elderly Homeowner & Totally Disabled Programs. Application forms may be filled out in the Assessor's Office.

QUALIFIERS - One spouse has to be 65 years of age by 12/31/24

Totally Disabled persons need only to qualify under the income and submit proof of the Social Security Disability Form.

MAXIMUM INCOME	MARRIED	\$ 55,100
(Including Social Security)	SINGLE	\$ 45,200

PROOF: Bring with you all proof of income. Social Security, Interest Income on Savings, Pensions, etc.

INCOME: Work Earnings, Interest of Stocks & Bonds, etc. for 2024.

YOU MUST bring your 1099 SOCIAL SECURITY STATEMENT, which was mailed to you in January 2025, and shows your total income from Social Security during 2024. If you file an ***INCOME TAX RETURN (2024)***
YOU MUST BRING A COPY TO THE ASSESSOR'S OFFICE

Governor Lamont Signs Law Establishing Property Tax Exemption for Veterans With Service-Connected Disabilities

Governor Ned Lamont signed a new law establishing property tax exemption for veterans with **SERVICE-CONNECTED DISABILITIES**. To receive the exemption, your Department of Veterans Affairs award letter must state exactly: **"YOU ARE CONSIDERED TO BE TOTALLY AND PERMANENTLY DISABLED DUE SOLELY TO YOUR SERVICE-CONNECTED DISABILITIES: YES"**

If your letter does not state this and you believe you may qualify for the exemption, you must contact the Department of Veterans Affairs to get an updated benefits statement and provide it to the Assessor's Office ASAP.

NOROVIRUS

Norovirus is a very contagious virus that causes vomiting and diarrhea. It causes acute gastroenteritis, an inflammation of the stomach or intestines. It is sometimes called the "stomach bug".

DID YOU KNOW?

Norovirus is the leading cause of vomiting, diarrhea, and foodborne illness in the U.S. It can affect anyone, but vulnerable groups: young children, older adults, and those with weakened immune systems are at higher risk for severe infections.

HOW DOES IT SPREAD?

Norovirus is found in the stool (poop) and vomit of people who are infected. You can get sick if norovirus germs get into your mouth. This can happen when you have:

- Direct contact with an infected person
- Consume contaminated food or liquids
- Touch contaminated surfaces and then put unwashed hands in your mouth

SYMPTOMS: appear 12 to 48 hours after exposure and include diarrhea, vomiting, nausea, stomach pain, fever, headache, and body aches.

Severe illness can lead to dehydration, especially in vulnerable groups. Symptoms of dehydration include decreased urination, dry mouth, and throat, dizziness, crying

with few tears, and unusual sleepiness.

HOW CAN I PREVENT THE SPREAD?

Take steps to protect yourself and others, including:



- **Wash hands frequently.**
- **Cook shellfish thoroughly; wash fruits and vegetables.**
- **Disinfect surfaces with a bleach solution.**
- **Wash laundry in hot water.**
- **Stay home for 48 hours after symptoms stop.**
- **Avoid preparing food for others when you are sick.**

TREATMENT AND RECOVERY

Most people recover from norovirus within **1 to 3 days**, and there is no specific medicine for it. Antibiotic drugs will not help treat norovirus infections because they fight bacteria, not viruses.

- Stay hydrated with fluids like water and broth.
- Rest, and eat bland foods (rice, crackers, toast, bananas).
- Avoid contact with others and stay home from school and work if you are sick. Contact your child's school nurse if they are feeling ill.
- If symptoms worsen or don't improve, contact a healthcare provider.



You can still spread the virus for up to 2 weeks after recovering.
