The Bloomfield Summer Youth Employment and Learning Program (SYELP) is a youth employment program, connecting Bloomfield youth between the ages of 14 and 17 with career exploration opportunities and paid work experience each summer. Filing Period runs through Sept. 30, 2025

Maximum Gross Income

Single Person: \$45,200
Married Couple: \$55,100

2024 tax return (if one was filed),
2024 rent payment history,
2024 utility payment history.*

The Matching Payment Program (MPP) can lower the amount you owe on energy bills. For every dollar you pay and every dollar you receive from the Connecticut Energy Assistance Program (CEAP), Eversource and CNG will subtract a dollar from the amount you owe up to a zero balance.

Teens can level up their knowledge of money, mental wellness and self- care, all while connecting with others from Windsor and Bloomfield.




